




Zoe Durkin

Tell us a little about your background

When I left school, I studied Business Travel achieving a distinction. Alongside being a student I was a store supervisor within the Arcadia Group. I decided I wanted to do something more admin based as I enjoyed the office work in my retail role and so I started at a well-known high street Bank as a Business Administrator in mortgages. I took an interest in HR when the HR team visited us and decided I wanted to pursue this as a career path. I was offered the role of a Resourcing Operations Coordinator covering the North East of England. I then became a HR Assistant, still within Bank. I learnt so much from my time there and I just knew that I wanted my career to remain within HR.

What is your job role?

I'm a Payroll Assistant within the Transactional Team providing beginning to end payroll services for Empowering People Group and some clients. Providing this payroll service means I must ensure that each employee is paid correctly and on time. I collate, calculate, and enter data in employee pay records and compile monthly, year to date, Tax & NI and pensions data each month for our clients.

Adhering to strict deadlines and legislations and balancing employee and employer figures is a huge responsibility within payroll. It can be challenging at times but I love a challenge!

What is your biggest professional acheivement?

When I was at college studying Business Travel. I was awarded an award at Leeds University for achieving the highest grade that anyone had got within 13 years.
